# **New Footscray Hospital**



### The Victorian government has provided up to \$1.5 billion to deliver a new Footscray Hospital.

The new Footscray Hospital- the largest ever health infrastructure investment in the State - will have an increase of nearly 200 beds, and will treat approximately 15,000 additional patients and enable around 20,000 additional people to be seen by the emergency department each year. Construction is almost complete, with the hospital on track to open in 2025.

# **New Melton Hospital**



### The Victorian government has committed more than \$900 million to deliver a new Melton Hospital.

Victoria's first all-electric hospital will support the growing and diverse communities in Melbourne's west. Generating more than 3,975 healthcare related jobs, it will have the capacity to treat 130,00 patients each year and 60,000 patients in the ED department alone. Construction is now underway, with the hospital expected to open in 2029.

# Grad+ Year 2

We offer a comprehensive program, to assist you with transitioning to the role of registered nurse. This program will enable you to deliver safe, effective patient care in a supportive environment.

#### Aim

The aim of this program is to develop graduate nurses who are resilient, reflective practitioners whilst learning clinical reasoning skills and demonstrating safe and effective care of patients at all times.

### **Learning Outcomes**

By the completion of your graduate program you should be able to:

- Demonstrate resilience in your working life and have developed strategies to deal with difficult situations
- Effectively plan for the day and seek help at appropriate times
- Demonstrate the ability to perform all the clinical skills you have learnt during the program
- Demonstrate the ability, at a beginning level, to utilise clinical reasoning in your daily practice
- Reflect on your practice and strive towards constant improvement

### Support

We are committed to offering a supportive program during your graduate years:

- A hospital orientation day and two graduate study days when you commence
- In each of your rotations you will be allocated a preceptor
- On each ward there is a ward based educator who will assist you in your transition and offer you a range of learning experiences throughout the program
- Your ward educator will complete your appraisals
- Five supernumerary days for your first rotation, and two for your second rotation
- Two further graduate specific study days
- Regular debrief sessions throughout the program
- A monthly debrief and regular on-line mini-modules with associated bedside coaching for the remainder of the program of the first year
- Two academic subjects that attract university credit in your second year (Grad+)



# Year 1 and Grad+ Year 2 Expectations

### **Graduate Nurse Program Year 1:**

- Attendance at all graduate study days
- Completion of all mandatory competencies
- Completion of a project each rotation
- Successful completion of all elements of the graduate nurse year

# Grad+ Year 2: \*Optional

Following the completion of Year 1, graduates have the option to apply to participate in an extended Grad+ Year 2 program.

- Completion of additional rotation/s
- Successful completion of all elements of Grad+ Year 2




