Western Health Specialist Clinics Access & Referral Guidelines

Lung Oncology Service at Western Health:

Western Health provides a multi-disciplinary Lung Cancer Service for patients who require management of lung conditions. Western Health has a team of staff who work together to provide a coordinated service to our patients. The specialist team of surgeons, medical oncologists, radiation oncologists, radiologists, palliative care physicians, nurses and pathologists work together to provide an integrated and comprehensive service.

Conditions not seen by Lung Oncology Services at Western Health:

- Patients with other non-cancer-like lung or respiratory symptoms may be appropriate for the Respiratory or **Thoracic Surgery Clinics**
- Incidental solid nodules <6mm may be rejected

Alarm Symptoms:

Patients presenting with the following RED FLAGS require immediate referral an Emergency Department:

- Moderate or severe haemoptysis
- Stridor
- **Respiratory Distress**
- Symptoms of superior vena cava obstruction

Access & Referral Priority Lung Oncology:

The clinical information provided in your referral will determine the triage category. The triage category will affect the timeframe in which the patient is offered an appointment.

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Condition Specific Referral Guidelines:

Key information enables Western Health to triage patients to the correct category and provide treatment with fewer visits to specialist clinics, creating more capacity for care. If key information is missing, you may be asked to return the referral with the required information.
